# Painless Dentistry! The Impossible Dream, You Say? Maybe Not!

At least, if most or much of your dental pain comes from your wallet, there may be a whole lot less pain in your near future. Certainly, I've always thought that having to hand out money at the end of each dental visit felt like adding insult to injury. But I'm here to tell you that in 2024 I had 2 visits to my dentist and paid nothing – a first for me. And I'm going back for more “painless” dentistry this year.

## How Do I Qualify?

When the Buckhorn Branch of our Trent Lakes Library offered an opportunity to meet with a Service Canada consultant to learn more about the new Dental Plan, I couldn't wait to go. I already think the plan is wonderful after my experience last year. What's not to like? But I know a lot of people who seem to regard the plan with suspicion and believe they have no reason to pay any attention to it. Truth to tell, there were many dentists who told their patients at first that they would not participate in the plan – it required too much paperwork. But, that has all changed – now dentists are required to do no more paperwork than they would for any other dental insurance.

Here's the scoop – if you:

- are more than 65 (or less than 18)
- have no private dental plan
- had an “adjusted family net income” of less than \$90,000 in 2024, and
- paid your taxes that year in a timely way

you too can benefit from the plan.

You may also qualify even if you have dental coverage through another government social program. And, this year, the age restriction in intended to be removed. (However, as you know, federal political changes are in the works, so, who knows for sure?)

## So What Is Covered?

Of course, not everything your dentist might suggest you need is covered. And, some dentists charge more for some procedures than the amount that is covered (not my dentist though, whew!).

Coverage includes:

- diagnostic and preventive services (dental exams, x-rays, cleaning, fluoride applications and sealants)
- basic services, including:
  - restorations (e.g., fillings, pain control and other treatments for cavities)
  - endodontics (e.g., root canals)
  - periodontal services (e.g., cleaning under the gumline, treating abscesses, bonding for mobile teeth)
- major services, such as restorations (posts and repairs to crowns)
- removable prosthodontics, such as dentures, denture repairs and relines, and
- anesthesia and sedation.

Some procedures will require specific pre-approval. But, it can't hurt to ask!

## So What Should I Do Now?

If you qualified in 2024, you probably received a letter telling you so at some point. I grabbed my letter and enrolled immediately, but none of the friends I have talked to about it did so. As I said, many seemed to regard it with suspicion and belief that it wouldn't work out anyway. Don't worry if you can no longer find (or even remember) the letter.

If you think you might qualify, it is best to contact Service Canada. This is not as daunting as you might think. The Citizen Services Specialist who visited the Buckhorn Library was approachable, knowledgeable, compassionate and funny beyond all expectations. To talk to such a person about your particular situation you can:

- phone 1-833-537-4342 (8:30-4:30) Monday to Friday; TTY 1-833-677-6262 7:00 am-7:30 pm Monday to Friday), or
- visit our nearest Service Canada office at Peterborough (219 George Street North); there are also offices in Lindsay and Bancroft (all are open Monday to Friday 8:30 am to 4:00 pm); and a Service Canada representative is at Haliburton on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday of each month from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm (Fleming College Resource Centre), or
- check out the service Canada website – [Canada.ca/dental](http://Canada.ca/dental), or search on Service Canada Dental.

## Then What?

You will need to identify yourself with a passport, permanent resident card, Certificate of Indian Status or a provincial ID card or driver's license. If you don't have any of these, you can learn from the website or a telephone call what alternative would be acceptable. Then, be prepared to smile!

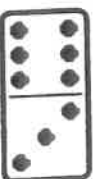

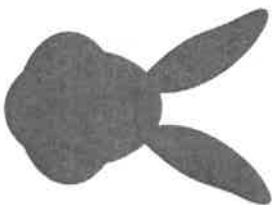


### Interested in Playing Volleyball?

## Recipe of the Month



### BEST EVER BANANA MUFFINS

3 to 4 medium bananas, mashed (about 1 cup)	1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
3/4 cup sugar	1 tsp baking powder
1 egg	1 tsp baking soda
1/2 cup melted butter or margarine	1/2 tsp salt
1 tsp vanilla	1/2 cup chopped walnuts, optional

Mix mashed bananas, sugar, egg, vanilla and melted butter together in large bowl. In another bowl, mix flour, baking powder, baking soda and walnuts together. Pour dry mixture over liquid mixture; stir until just blended. Put into greased muffin cups. Bake at 375° F for 20 minutes.

- 17<sup>th</sup> to the 31<sup>st</sup> – sunny days and warm

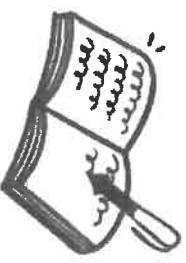
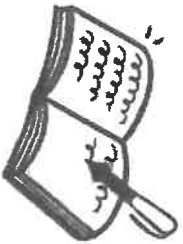

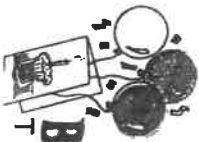
"The 507 Express Cookbook"

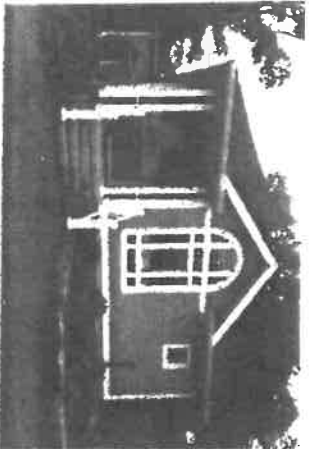

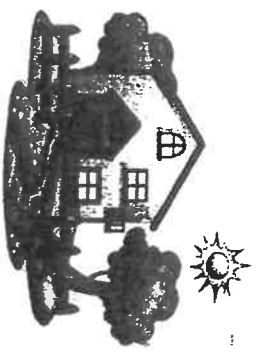

## HOUSEHOLD HINTS

- Add a teaspoon of vinegar to your dishwasher for spot – free dishes
- Remove smudges from stainless steel sinks and appliances by spraying with undiluted white vinegar and rub gently with microfiber cloth following the grain of the metal. Rinse with damp cloth and buff to shine.
- Freshen microwave – boil one cup of water in a bowl with lemon slices or one cup distilled vinegar. Heat to boiling and let sit for at least 5 minutes.
- Fix sputtering shower heads by soaking in distilled white vinegar in a bucket overnight. If the showerhead will not come off – fill plastic bag with vinegar and attach to showerhead with several elastic bands. Remove next morning and turn on water to rinse minerals away.
- Use a synthetic wine cork to seal partially used tubes of caulk. Drill 5/16<sup>th</sup> inch hole into cork about 1 inch deep.
- Use six-pack cartons (beer & coolers) for storing and transporting items like spray paint, lubricants, and caulk.
- When painting or gardening put your cell phone into a zip lock bag to keep it clean
- Coat your face and arms with lotion before painting and the splatters will wash off effortlessly.
- Wrap your flashlight with glow-in-the-dark tape. When the power goes out it will be easy to find. Tape glows for up to eight hours when exposed to light.
- Pick up small shards of broken glass with one of the following:
  - o Fresh slice of bread
  - o Sliced potato
  - o Several layers of wet paper towels
  - o Lint roller



## Gardening Tips

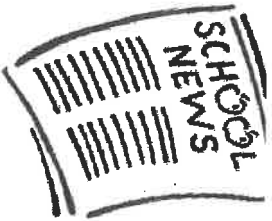
- Feed plants and repost for optimal growth.
- Plan out your garden to make sure growing conditions for all your plants are met.
- Consider growing vertical gardens for extra space.
- Remove suckers from fruiting trees
- Start seedlings of annuals in flats
- Spread dark plastic intended for mulch out over the garden site to hasten the warming of the soil. This will provide for earlier and better germination.
- Try using a meat basting syringe to water your seedlings
- Prune evergreen flowering trees and shrubs. Prune spring flowering shrubs only after they have bloomed.
- Start sowing seeds indoors such as:
  - o Asparagus
  - o Arugula
  - o Peas
  - o Sesame
  - o Lettuce
  - o Catnip
  - o Mint
  - o Bergamot
  - o Basil
  - o Sage
  - o Digitalis
  - o Thyme

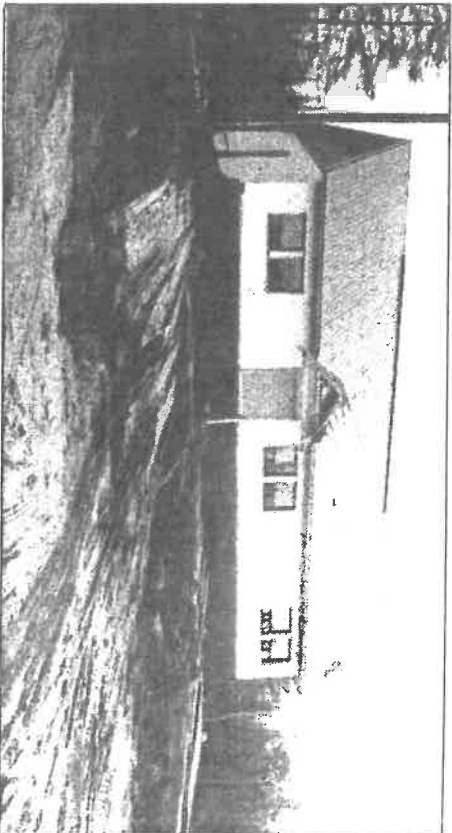

## Fire extinguishers

Purchase a fire extinguisher for your home and keep it handy in the event of a small fire. Make sure you know what to look for when buying a fire extinguisher for your home.

- Always check for certification marks, such as ULC.
- Fire extinguishers indicate the type of fire that they are designed to extinguish with a letter and the size of fire that they can extinguish with a number. The higher the number rating on the fire extinguisher, the more fire it puts out.
- It is important to make sure you can comfortably hold and operate the fire extinguisher you buy.
- To use the fire extinguisher, remember the order of operations: P.A.S.S.
  - Pull – the pin
  - Aim – at the base of the fire
  - Squeeze – the trigger
  - Sweep – back and forth at the base of the fire vigorously.
- If you have a rechargeable fire extinguisher, have it serviced and inspected according to the manufacturer's instructions, and recharge it after each use.
- Install your fire extinguisher near an escape route and away from potential fire hazards.

### Did you know?

Smoking is one of the leading causes of house fires. Smokers should regularly check their furniture and bed for fallen embers, which can smoulder for hours before bursting into flames. Make sure to properly extinguish any lit items and never leave them unattended.

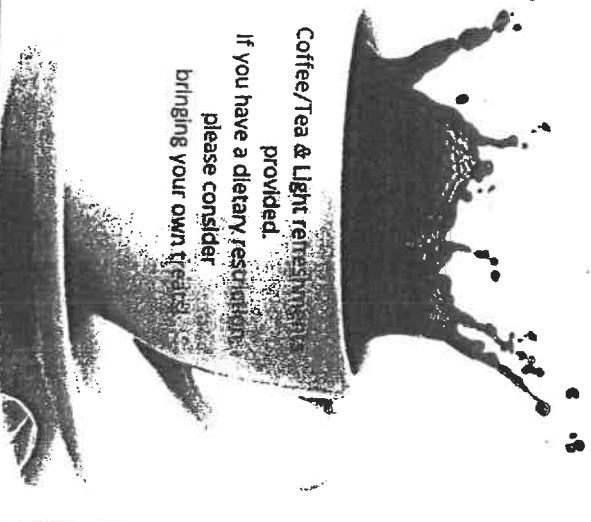

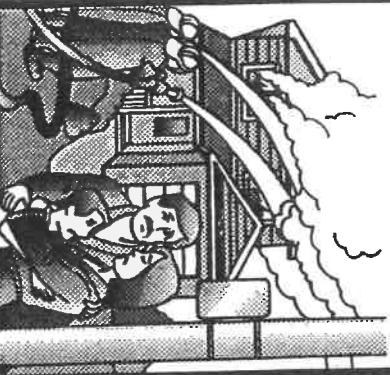

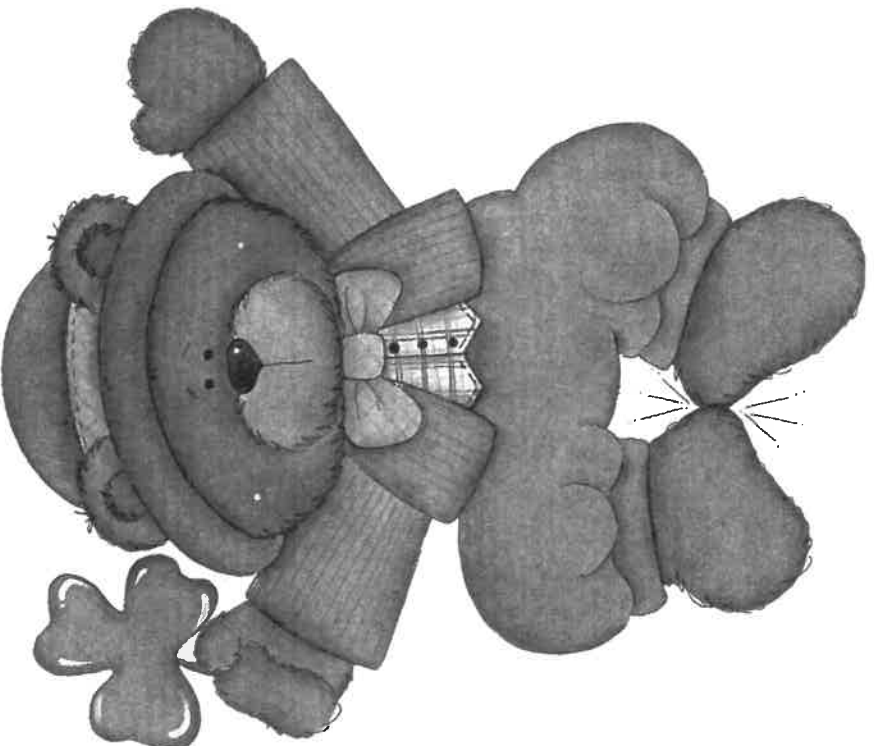
