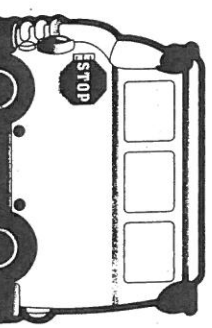

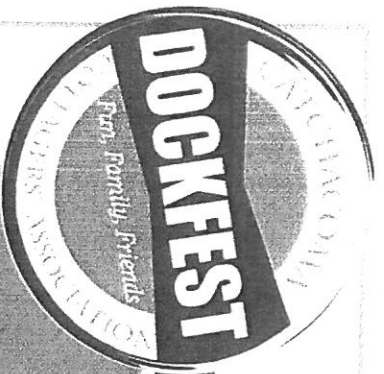


## Buses for 2024-2025 School Year

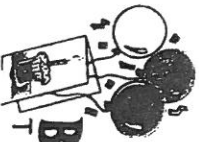

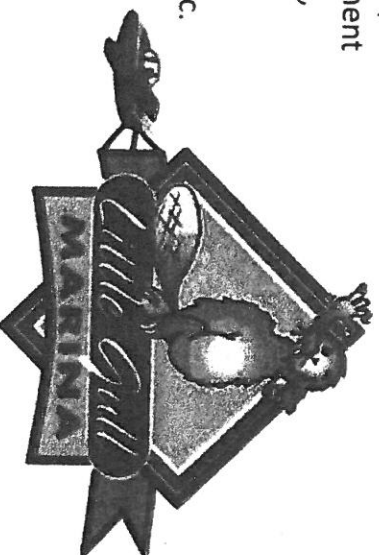

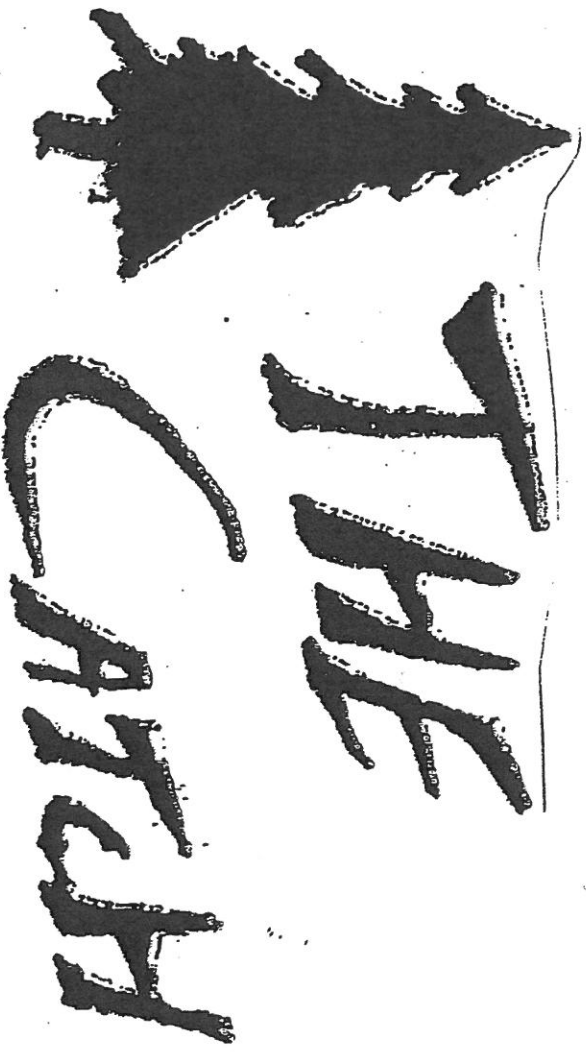

## Do You Use Drugs?

Reading This Could Save Your Life!

### WARNING: Drug Checking ALERT in Peterborough Region

May 6, 2024 - Peterborough Public Health is issuing an alert following a trigger of the Early Warning Surveillance System (EWSS). Details on this event are below:

Two substances being sold as **Down**.

- Tested positive for benzos and fentanyl. They are suspected to contain **Bromazolam**.
- Light yellow and pink in colour OR light green in colour.
- Heavy and immediate sedative effects.
- High number (8) of 911 EMS Calls and ED Visits detected on Friday, May 3, 2024.

Naloxone cannot reverse the effects of sedatives, but it can't hurt! **Use naloxone if you suspect a drug poisoning!**

- Available at Consumption & Treatment Site (CTS) – 220 Simcoe St.

- Test strips for fentanyl, benzos, and xylazine are available at the CTS during hours of operation (9:30 a.m. – 9:00 p.m.; daily)

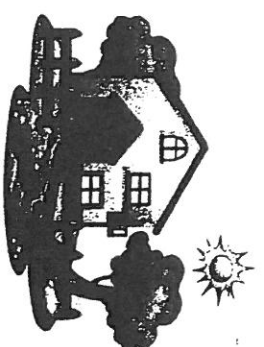

## HOUSEHOLD HINTS

- Deodorize travel mugs, thermoses, and decanters with salt and warm water. Rinse thoroughly.
- To remove dust that accumulates on silk flowers, put them in a bag with ¼ cup of salt; shake gently.
- Clean flour from countertops with no clumpy mess! Simply sprinkle surface with salt before wiping.
- Something smells fishy? Rub hand and cutting surface with a lemon wedge. freeze lemon juice in an ice try to use later in cooking.
- For natural highlights, squeeze lemon juice on your hair before your final rinse.
- Unpleasant fireplace of odor? Burn a few lemon peels along with the firewood.
- Simmer a sliced lemon to freshen the house. For fuller fragrance, add a few cinnamon sticks.
- Place lemon slices on a dish in the bathroom or near the cat's litter box to sweeten the air.
- Scrub cheese graters with a lemon wedge to remove stuck food particles.
- Brighten dull fingernails by scrubbing them with a lemon wedge.

To minimize the risk of fire and burn injury follow these fire safety tips:

- Install smoke alarms. It's the law for all of Ontario – have a working smoke alarm on every storey and outside all sleeping areas.
- Install carbon monoxide alarms if you use a fuel-burning appliance
- Test smoke and CO alarms at least monthly or each time your return to the cottage. Pack new alarms and batteries when you are going to the cottage in case they need to be replaced.
- Develop and practice a fire escape plan to ensure everyone knows what to do if the smoke alarm sounds
- Know the telephone number for the local fire department and your emergency sign number – civic address. (green sign)
- Clean barbecues before using them. Keep an eye on lit barbecues and ensure all combustibles, as well as children and pets, are kept well away from them. Fires can happen when barbecues are left unattended
- Keep barbecue lighters and matches out of sight and reach of children
- Remember to have on hand a flashlight with extra batteries
- Check heating appliances and chimneys before using them
- Check with your local fire department to determine whether open-air burning is permitted before having a campfire or burning brush. If open burning is allowed, fires should be kept on bare soil or exposed rock. Remove leaves and twigs from around the fire to keep it from spreading. Always keep a bucket of water, sand or even a shovel close by and supervise the fire at all times.
- Smoke outside. Keep a large can with water nearby so cigarette butts can be safely discarded
- Drink responsibly. Tobacco use and excessive alcohol consumption are contributing factors in many fires and can lead to serious injuries.
- Burn candles in sturdy candle holders that will not tip and are covered with a glass shape. When you go out, blow out!
- Unattended cooking is a leading cause of home fires – be alert, no dot cook if you are sleepy or have consumed alcohol, drugs or medicine that makes you drowsy.
- Always stay in the kitchen while cooking and turn off the stove if you must leave
- Keep anything that burns a safe distance from the stove, including: oven mitts, cooking utensils, dishcloths and paper towels.
- Keep a proper-fitting pot lid near the stove when cooking so you can slide the lid over the pot and turn off the stove if the pot catches fire. Do not move the pot until it has cooled completely.
- Wear short or tight sleeves or roll sleeves up when cooking, to avoid loose-fitting clothes from catching fire on stove burners.

### DEPUTY MAYOR UPDATE

Highlights of Trent Lakes Council Meetings  
**March - May 2024**

- A new program to assist residents on private roads will be starting September 2024. These grants (max \$3,000 per road association, total budget \$30,000) will assist property owners with costs for the maintenance of private roads (e.g., road grading, tree removal and trimming, noxious weed control, gravel, dust control, roadside mowing, road drainage, road reconstruction, road surfacing and winter maintenance), resulting in better accessibility and safety for the traffic. [private road grant](#)
- The County is reviewing options for expanding organics collection, now that the new processing facility is open (see p.2)
- The audit of 2023 Financials concluded, once again, that Trent Lakes' financial position is healthy and that planning and management of operational and capital costs is sound. [2023 Audit](#)
- The Short Term Rental Licensing proposal is complete and public feedback is being sought. (See p. 2)
- The second annual Clean Roads Program was highly successful, with many groups showing up to clear our roadsides of carelessly tossed litter. For the first time in 12 years, the fees for planning applications (minor variance, zoning bylaw amendment, severance, official plan amendment, etc.) have been adjusted to reflect actual processing costs. Budgets and Rates for the 2 Municipal water systems (Alpine Ridge / Pirates Glen and Buckhorn Lake Estates) have been set for 2024.
- An appeal to the Ontario Land Trust by Dewdney Mountain Farms Ltd has been adjourned.
- The report of Q1 2024 operational services has been published at: [Q1 Service Report](#) PLEASE review all the support services provided by staff for our residents.
- Plans for replacement of the Buckhorn Public Works and Fire Station with a combined facility in 2025/2026 have begun. Meantime, the new Public Works, Centralized mechanics and Recreation and Facilities building north of Bobcaygeon continues on time and on budget. (Photos below)

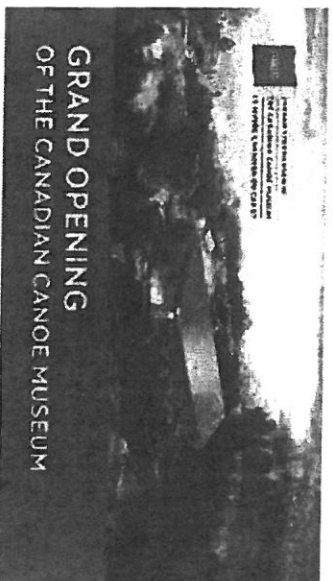

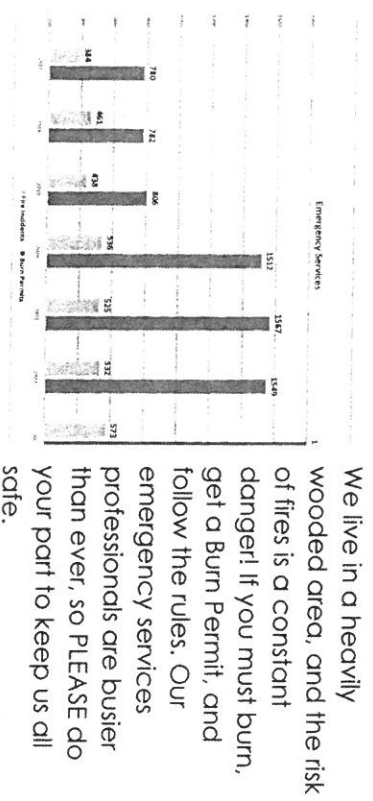
## SHORT TERM RENTALS

The Municipality of Trent Lakes is moving to Phase 3 – Licensing - of its three (3) year phased program to recognize and address the emergence of Short-Term Residential Rental properties. 3 year [STR plan](#).

The draft Short-Term Rental Accommodation (STRA) Licensing By-Law has been developed to license and regulate short-term rental properties, to provide safe accommodation options to support Trent Lakes tourist industry while allowing residents the opportunity to use their properties to earn additional income. Short-term rental regulations assist in responding to health, safety and nuisance concerns related to excessive noise, garbage, parking and security issues, while enabling all property owners to enjoy their properties. The STRA Licensing By-Law is an enhanced tool to address issues that may arise. Over 50 municipalities in Ontario have already implemented Short-Term Rental regulations through licensing by-laws.

## Recipe of the Month

### SQUIRREL FOOD

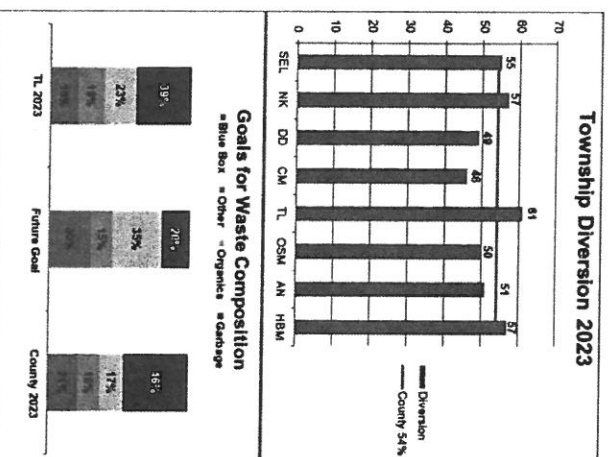

| 1 tsp salt                  | 3/4 cup walnuts     |
| 1/2 cup butter or margarine | 3/4 cup cherries    |
| 1 cup brown sugar           | 3/4 cup dates       |
| 2 egg yolks                 | 3/4 cup coconut     |
| 1 tsp vanilla               | 1/2 tsp vanilla     |

Mix the first 7 ingredients together and place into a 6x12 inch pan. Combine the remaining ingredients and pour on top of crust. Bake for 40 minutes at 350° F.



## WASTE

Trent Lakes continues to lead the County of PIBO in diversion of its waste – Thanks to ALL of you who are conscientious about disposal of waste. Despite our best efforts to divert organics from landfill with composting, food cyclers and reduced purchases (we diverted 177 tonnes in 2023!!!) organics still comprise 30 – 40% of all the garbage going into landfills.



But, there is good news!

The city of Peterborough recently completed construction and started operation of its **Grow Organics Facility** in February. It was built to intake organics from the City and all 8 Municipalities in the County. This facility uses the Gore System, which breaks down organics over a three-step process that masks methane from being made, and slowly breaks down materials through a series of bunkers dedicated to dewatering, reduction of premature waste, and then uncovered for a final two weeks before processing and packaging.

The contractor that runs the facility keeps the final product which is used on agricultural fields, landscaping etc. The City keeps about 10% to use at City parks and outdoor spaces.

The County is exploring ways to collect more organics in Trent Lakes to "feed" this plant and to further reduce landfill garbage. Not so Fun Fact: Across Ontario, landfill sites have an average of less than 10 years of useful life remaining.

July 13<sup>th</sup>, 1932 – Astrophysicist Hubert Reeves was born.

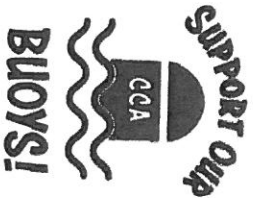

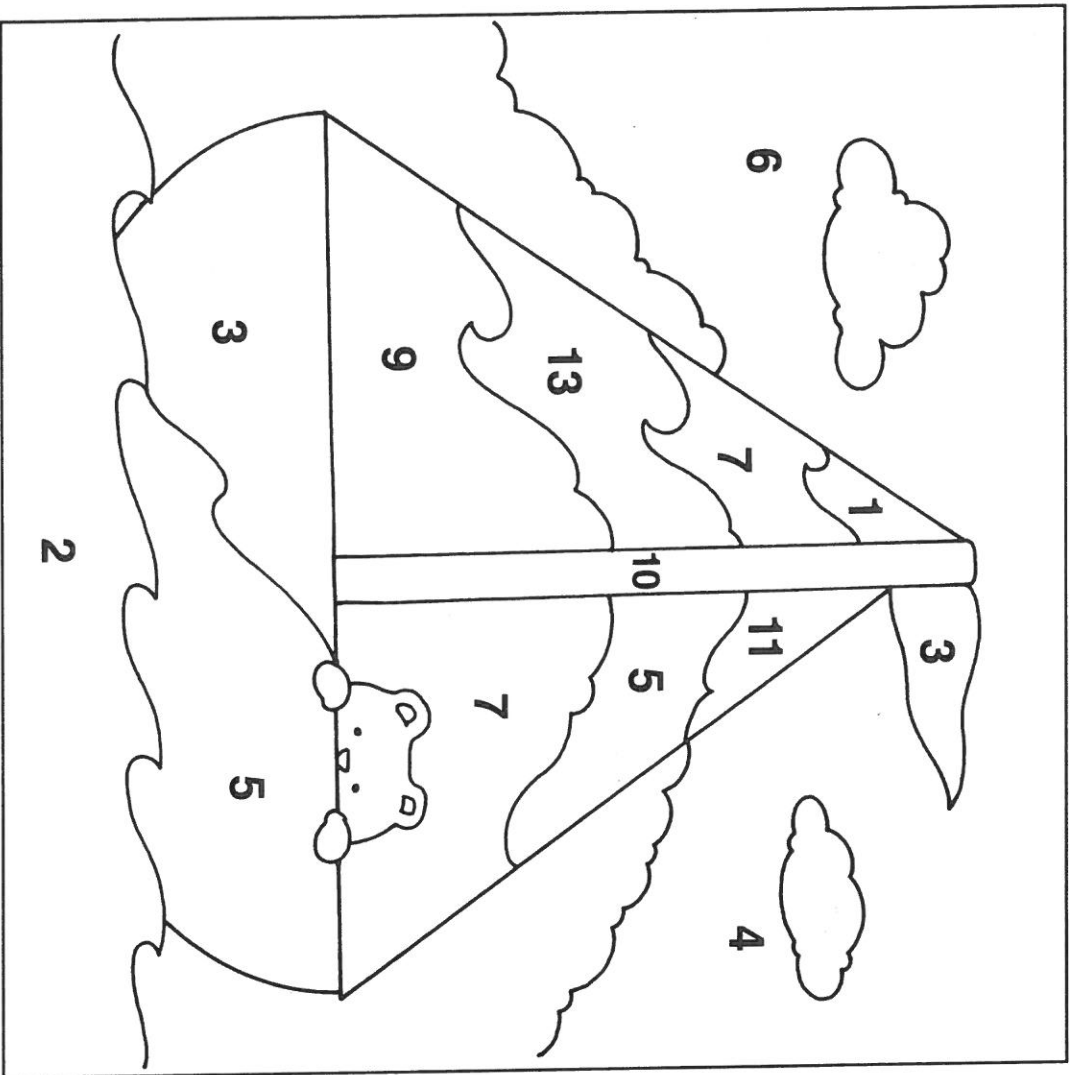

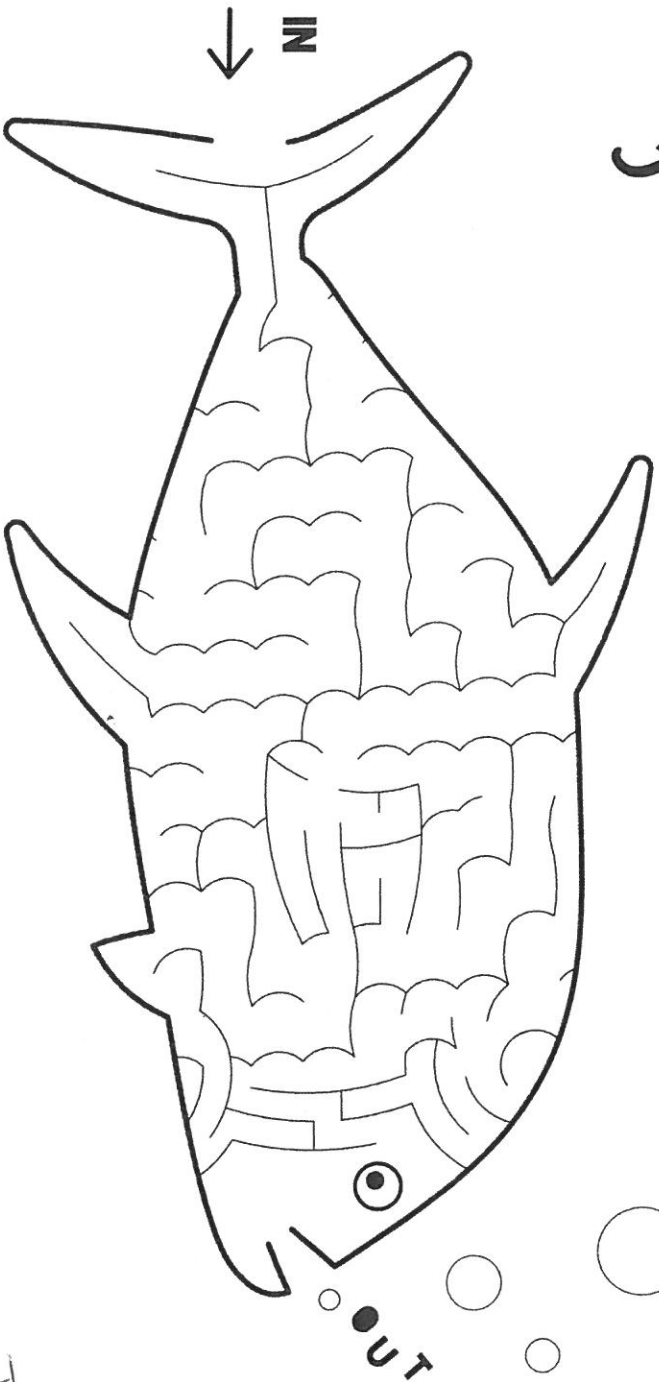

## **We Were Part of a Big Hit: The Pancreatic Cancer Canada Ride**

In late May, Cavendish Community Centre welcomed about 25 wet, cold (but fit and determined) bicyclists on day 1 of their 7-day ride. Cycling for Survival is an annual event to raise awareness of and money for Pancreatic Cancer Canada. If you were anywhere around here, you will remember that bone-chilling, relentlessly rainy day. Those of us who were cozily staring out the front windows as they arrived could only scold ourselves for our wimpishness.

The riders appeared in 3 batches. The first arrivals included at least 2 "retired" triathletes – right, retired! – to become long-distance bicyclists, rain or shine! They would probably have ridden through ice and snow with few qualms.

### **Who Were They?**

I felt some guilt for disturbing the cold, dripping, athletes gamely gulping down coffee, water and calorific treats provided by "core" and "local volunteers." Nevertheless, I put on my journalist hat and went ahead. All the riders I talked to had engaging stories. There was:

- Chris Henrickson came from Sarnia – we laughed about how he was more accustomed to cycling in southwestern Ontario, which often appears flatter than the Prairies; nevertheless, it was his 6<sup>th</sup> (!) full 7-day ride and he does it because, well, he "likes cycling" and also "giving back," and riding for the cause "just makes life better"
- Stuart Wong is from Waterloo – he is one of those retired triathletes and this was his 2<sup>nd</sup> year; he recalled his many friends who have had cancer and confessed that his friend Patty finally "recruited" him for the ride
- Patty Warr ("the recruiter") from Kitchener just "loves to ride [her] bike all day;" this was her 7<sup>th</sup> year and she has retired from Ironman triathlons (yes, participating women apparently are also called ironmen) – she calls Cycling for Survival "a special week, with great people"
- Waheed Hirji flew in from Vancouver – for the last 3 years he has come to Ontario to participate in this event and then another unrelated cancer fundraiser (it makes me tired just to think about all that!); but at least Waheed is unfazed by our local hills; he had recently lost his mom, his father-in-law and a friend to cancer and, like the others, he "has a passion for giving back, and for community," and
- Lois Cormack from Schomberg had known about the ride for a long time but finally got involved only this year after a friend died of pancreatic cancer – by the day of the ride she had raised \$15,000 for the cause.

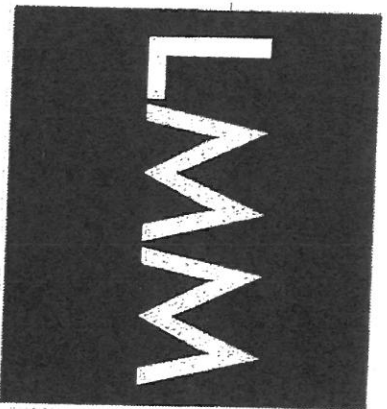
Local volunteers included Jill and Roy Vandal from Lake Catchacoma. Last year they were part of the core volunteer corps (working on all 7 days). This year they volunteered on the Peterborough days and at our community centre. The core volunteers arrive well before the first riders and then clean up before rushing off to set up the next stop. I can imagine that they get almost as tired as the riders. Jill reported that the facilities at Cavendish were superior to those found at many stops last year. Just as well, as an outdoor stop wouldn't have been all that welcome on that particular day. That said, the riders (anonymously) requested a hot tub for next year!

### **Speaking of Money**

As of mid-June, Cycling for Survival had raised \$244,000 towards its \$250,000 goal. ### **Other Highlights of the Ride**

The OPP Commissioner joined the ride on the first day from Peterborough to Bancroft. In addition, firefighters in Barrie welcomed the riders, made a special donation and later accompanied them out of town. On the final day in Peterborough, 42 other cyclists joined the heroic riders as they pedalled through downtown Peterborough to the celebration at Millennium Park. That celebration included wood-fired pizzas (by Lowlands) sponsored by the family of Dan Murphy (a stage-4 survivor who greeted riders at Aurora last year and again in Peterborough), followed by cake and ice cream sponsored by the Peterborough firefighters, and massages by Euphoria Spa.

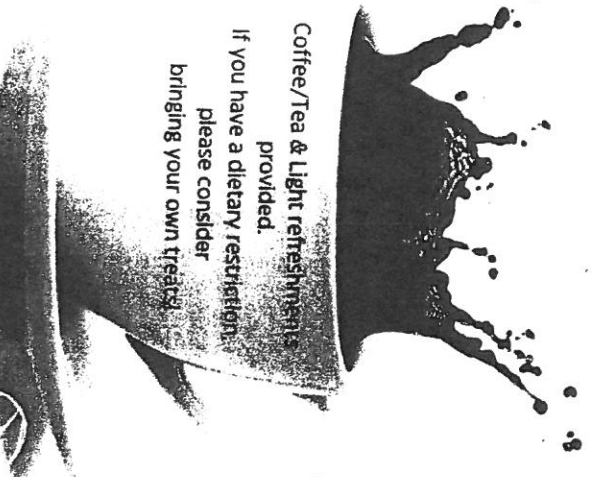

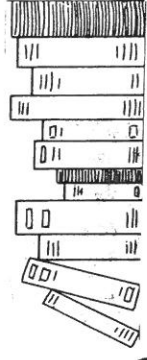
