



### **Christmas Trees**



When purchasing an artificial tree, look for the label "Fire Resistant." Although this label does not mean the tree won't catch fire, it does indicate the tree will resist burning and should extinguish quickly.

## **Lights and Electrical**

- Indoors or outside, always use CSA-approved lights. Check each set of lights, new or old, for broken or cracked sockets, frayed or bare wires, or loose connections, and throw out damaged sets.
- Use no more than three standard-size sets of lights per single extension cord
- from faulty lights, and a person touching a branch could be electrocuted. Never use electric lights on a metallic tree. The tree can become charged with electricity
- Fasten outdoor lights securely to trees, house walls or other firm supports to protect the place. Or, run strings of lights through hooks (available at hardware stores). lights from wind damage. Use only insulated staples, not nails or tacks, to hold strings in
- Turn off all lights when you go to bed or leave the house. The lights could short out and
- For added electric-shock protection, plug outdoor electric lights and decorations into be purchased where electrical supplies are sold. - Keep anything that can burn at least three-feet away from heating equipment, like the furnace, fireplace, wood stove, or portable space heater.
- Have a three-foot "kid-free zone" around open fires and space heaters
- Never use your oven to heat your home.
- Have a qualified professional install stationary space heating equipment, water heaters or central heating equipment according to the local codes and manufacturer's instructions.
- Have heating equipment and chimneys cleaned and inspected every year by a qualified professional.
- Remember to turn portable heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed.
- Always use the right kind of fuel, specified by the manufacturer, for fuel burning space
- Be sure all furnace controls and emergency shutoffs are in proper working condition
- Leave furnace repairs to qualified specialists. Do not attempt repairs yourself unless you are qualified.
- Inspect the walls and ceiling near the furnace and along the chimney line. If the wall is hot or discoloured, additional pipe insulation or clearance may be required.
- Soot along or around seams may be an indicator of a leak. Check the flue pipe and pipe seams. Are they well supported, free of holes and cracks?
- Is the chimney solid, with cracks or loose bricks? All unused flue openings should be sealed with solid masonry.
- Keep trash and other combustibles away from the heating system

### The Kitchen

- Be on alert! If you are sleepy or have consumed alcohol don't use the stove or stovetop.
- Stay in the kitchen while you are frying, grilling, or broiling food. If you leave the kitchen for even a short period of time, turn off the stove.
- If you are simmering, baking, roasting, or boiling food, check it regularly, remain in the home while food is cooking, and use a timer to remind you that you are cooking.
- Keep anything that can catch fire or curtains – away from your stovetop. oven mitts, wooden utensils, food packaging, towels
- Grease and fat fires are a leading cause of home fires in Canada, so be extra careful when Have a "kid-free zone" of at least 3 feet around the stove and areas where hot food or drink is prepared or carried.

doing this kind of cooking. Here's what to do if grease in a pot or pan catches fire: Smother the flames by covering the pan with a lid. Do not remove the lid until the pan is completely

- Turn off the heat immediately.
- Use baking soda (flour can be explosive) on shallow grease fires
- Never turn on the overhead fan, as this could spread the fire
- Never throw water on a grease fire




2 cups flour 1 cup finely chopped nuts




