POTATO BROCCOLI CASSEROLE

3 Tbsp (45 mL) flour 2 1/2 cups (625 mL) milk 1 1/2 lb (675 g) potatoes 1/4 cup (50 mL) butter 1/2 tsp (2 mL) salt

1/4 tsp (1 mL) pepper 1 lb (450 g) broccoli 1/2 cup (125 mL) grated Parmesan cheese


