

Why are they selling poppies, Mummy? The poppies, child, are flowers of love For the men who marched away. Selling poppies in town today.


But why have they chosen a poppy, Mummy? Why not a beautiful rose? Because my child, men fought and died In the fields where the poppies grow.

## Recipe of the Month

## HOMEMADE TACO SHELLS

1/2 cup cornmeal 1/2 cups cold water cup all-purpose flour

Vegetable oil 1/4 tsp salt

1 egg

Cook until dry around the edges, turn and cook other side until golden, about 2 minutes longer. Heat 1 inch of oil, in a 3 quart saucepan, to 375°F. Slide tortilla into oil. Fold in 1/2 with 2 forks or tongs and hold so that 1 inch remains between halves. Fry, turning occasionally, until crisp and golden brown; drain on paper towel. Yield: 1 dozen shells. rotate skillet until batter forms very thin tortilla about 6 inches in diameter Heat an 8 inch skillet, over medium/low heat, just until hot. Grease skillet if necessary. Beat water, flour, cornmeal, salt and egg together, by hand, until smooth. Pour 1/4 to 1/3 cup of batter into skillet and immediately



### Heating safety

Stay safe while keeping warm. To prevent fires:



- ensure woodstoves, fireplaces and fireplace inserts are installed by a qualified technician according to the manufacturer's instructions
- have your heating system, vents and chimneys inspected and cleaned annually by a qualified service technician
- ensure all outside heating vents are not blocked
- let ashes from your woodstove or fireplace cool before emptying them into a metal container with a tight-fitting lid and keep the container outside
- always use a fire screen in front of a fireplace
- burn dry, well-seasoned wood in fireplaces and woodstoves to reduce the risk of excessive creosote build-up in chimneys
- keep space heaters at least one metre or three feet away from anything that can burn, including curtains, upholstery and clothing

In relation to heating and vehicle safety:

- replace worn or damaged electrical wires and connections on vehicles and extension cords and use the proper gauge extension cord for vehicle block
- consider using approved timers for vehicle block heaters rather than leaving heaters on all night
- ensure that vehicles are not left running inside any garage or building
